

College Sport Auckland Archery League Entry & Competition Information 2024

Dates

- Ranking Round: Wednesday 14th February 2024
- League: Wednesday 21 February, 28 February, 6 March, 13 March, 20 March
- Prize giving Shoot: Wednesday 27 March

Venues

- Auckland Archery Club, Bollard Ave, One Tree Hill Domain
- Mountain Green Archery Club, Ōwairaka Domain, Summit Drive, Mount Albert, Auckland.
- Shore Archery Club, 9 Argus Place, Glenfield (if sufficient entries are received)

Shoot

- 30 arrows at 18m, 6 arrow ends, 10 zone scoring
- One 6-arrow sighting end to start
- Individual and Team Event

Face Sizes

- 80cm full face for Recurve and Barebow/Longbow
- 40cm full face for Compound

Bow Types and Divisions:

- **Recurve Teams:** 4 archers of any age and gender.
- **Compound Pairs:** 2 archers of any age and gender.
- Barebow/Longbow Pairs (NEW): 2 archers of any age and gender.
- Recurve Individuals
- Compound Individuals
- Barebow/Longbow Individuals
- If your school does not have enough archers to make a team, you may enter an archer into the individual competition. All archers entered in a team will automatically be entered in the individual competition.
- <u>Barebow archers</u> may shoot as part of a Recurve team, and their individual score will count towards the barebow individual event. If shooting in a Recurve team, they <u>may not</u> also shoot in a Barebow team. They can only be part of one team. Please ensure this is marked clearly when entering.

Entries & Team Registration

• Entries must be submitted in <u>EnterNOW</u> by 11.59pm **Wednesday 7th February.**

• <u>NEW:</u> Teams will <u>not</u> be able to be changed after the ranking round. Please ensure your final teams are submitted on initial entry.

- Students who have not been entered via EnterNOW will not be permitted to shoot.
- Any late entries or substitutions must be approved by the event manager and entered via ENTERNOW.
- Archers withdrawn after the entries closing date on Wednesday 7th February will still be liable for the entry fee. College Sport Auckland will invoice schools after the entry's closing date.
- Organisers will endeavor to accommodate all entries however they may be limited depending on target and venue availability.

Eligibility

- All archers must have had at least one term experience under the supervision of a qualified instructor. Archers deemed to have insufficient experience will be defaulted at the discretion of the range captain.
- Refer to the College Sport Auckland <u>Bylaws</u> for further eligibility requirements.

Competition Format

The team competition will be in round robin format, with six teams per grade, each playing every other team once. Each match shall be a competition based on cumulative score for each team with the total team score at the end determining placings for the match.

Points for teams shall be allocated as follows:

•	Win	3 points
•	Draw	1 point
-	1	0

- Loss 0 points
- Abandoned match 1 point each
- Default win 3 points
- Default loss 0 points

All archers will also compete in an individual competition which will run alongside the team event with each archer being awarded ranked points based on their score each week. Final placings with be based on total cumulative ranked points.

Archers shall use approved scorecards with double scoring. See scoring notes at the end for detailed instructions on how this works. It is the responsibility of all archers on the target to ensure that all scorecards are filled out accurately and signed on completion.

School managers are responsible for ensuring all totals and details on both teams' scoresheets for that target match are correct. It is important that all archers and school Managers check the addition for each archer before transferring each archer's results to the Results Summary Sheet. Managers shall then sign the Results Summary Sheet to confirm that they have checked and confirmed the total score and the Results Summary Sheet should be then handed to the venue administrator or range captain.

Other than the rules stated World Archery rules shall apply.

Grades

Teams will be seeded into divisions (Division 1, Division 2 etc.) based on results from the ranking round. All recurve, barebow and compound <u>team</u> archers need to attend the ranking round shoot.

Team members cannot be changed from the ranking round without permission from the event coordinator.

All archers entered into the ranking round will incur the full entry fee regardless of whether they compete in the full competition or not.

Once ranked into a division, individual archers may only shoot up a division, not down, if filling in as a reserve for another team. Individuals not placed in a team may act as a reserve for any team.

Draws & Times

Draws may change at any time throughout the season so please check the College Sport Auckland website regularly. It is important for all archers to be at the venue *at least 15 minutes prior to starting*.

It is anticipated that matches will run between 4.10 pm - 5.10 pm and 5.15 pm - 6.15 pm. Final times to be advised based on the number of entries and the ranking results.

If enough entries are received, once division will be run at Mountain Green Archery Club and/or Shore Archery Club.

In the case of more divisions being required, number of ends in matches may be shortened to finish in 40 minutes.

Results

- All Results Summary Sheets are to be handed to the range captain or venue administrator on completion of the round, having been signed off by the School Manager that the results are true and correct for that team.
- Any disputes or corrections to results must be countersigned by the school manager for both teams and resubmitted to the event administrator by 12noon of the day following the match.
- Results are updated within two days of results sheets being received; they can be viewed online at the <u>College Sport Auckland Archery Draws & Results</u> page.
- Please use the official Results Summary Sheet.
- It is both schools' responsibility to check results are entered correctly and notify College Sport Auckland of any incorrect or missing results.
- If there is a conflict of scores between the 2 scoresheets for an individual archer, the lower score will be the one that is recorded on the Results Summary Sheet.

Resolution of Disputes:

- School Managers should endeavor to resolve between themselves any issue arising.
- Any disputes or corrections to results must be countersigned on the appropriate scoresheets by the school managers for both teams and resubmitted to the event administrator by 12noon of the day following the match.
- If dispute resolution is unsuccessful, College Sport Auckland rules will be followed.

Uniforms

All archers must wear matching school sport uniforms appropriate to the archery.

Any individual or team not in the correct uniform may be deemed to have defaulted, at the discretion of the range captain.

Team Management

There must be a school-approved adult in charge of their students at any venue for the entirety of the match where a school is competing.

Supervisors should identify themselves to each other at the start of the match.

School Managers must ensure that they are familiar with the health and safety regulations of the school and of the competition (see Range Safety Protocols) and that they have communicated these protocols to all their students.

If there is no supervision, a school will be deemed to have lost by default, and they shall not participate in the shoot. All Managers/supervisors are responsible for the health and safety of the students and for completing Results Summary Sheets.

Equipment

Equipment shall be dictated by World Archery rules for classification unless stated.

Archers using <u>Genesis bows</u> will compete in the following depending on their bow set up: no sight, finger release – Barebow; With a sight, finger release – Recurve; Use of any type of release aid – Compound.

Schools must all provide their own equipment including armguards, apart from targets and buttresses. No other equipment will be supplied under any circumstances by the host club.

The school manager is responsible for ensuring all archers have at least **<u>six matched</u>** arrows each week.

Range Management

Each competition will be under the control of the Range Captain who will be provided by the archery venue. The Range Captain will have the authority to prevent someone shooting if they are observed to act unsafely or to have insufficient archery experience.

Defaults & Cancellations

- It is the range captain's responsibility to cancel matches in dangerous weather (e.g. lightning storm or severe wind). Matches will generally not be cancelled for rain, and teams should be prepared for shooting in this eventuality with appropriate clothing.
- There is no allowance for matches to be rescheduled.
- If a team defaults three times during the competition, they will be removed from the competition for that year.
- The competition organiser has the right to alter these conditions.

Coach Training

Teachers or senior students over 16 may wish to learn how to effectively and safely lead and support archery training for students. Other Tournaments

- The College Sport Auckland Match Play Championships will be held **Sunday 7 April** 2024 at Auckland Archery Club and requires a separate entry via College Sport.
- Winter Aim Schools Archery Tournament Term 3 2024 date to be advised.
