### **Entries**

- Entries must be submitted online via EnterNOW by 11.59pm 6th September.
- College Sport will invoice schools once the entries have closed
- Teams withdrawn after the entry closing date will still be liable for the entry fee.
- Due to ccourt restrictions entries may be capped. Schools gain entry for 2 teams in Division 1 and 2 teams in Division 2. Additional teams will be added to a waitlist and may be added to a draw depending on entries.

# **Team Registration**

Team lists must be submitted online via <u>EnterNOW</u> by 11.59pm 9<sup>th</sup> September.

# **Team Composition**

• Teams consist of 4 players. 2 additional players can be added to the team lists and reserves and can be switched into the team throughout the competition.

#### Contest

- A tie shall consist of 4 singles and 2 doubles matches.
- Players compete in both singles and/or doubles in a tie
- Players may only compete for one team throughout the competition.

# **Team Management**

All teams must have a teacher or adult with them at every game. This person is to complete the score sheet before and after the game where needed, be aware of any medical problems of players in the team, implement the rules of the competition, and supervise the players. Teams without supervision may lose by default.

## Rules

- The games are played as all boys and all girls teams, with these competitions played on separate days. Please email College Sport to enquire for compensation for girls to play in the boys grade.

- All players must be attending the represented High School/College at the time of playing.
- All players must be graded before play commences and this has been given to the organiser in a written form.
- All players are expected to stay in the hall during the competition and be ready for their games when called.
- The number one graded player must play top doubles.
- The Badminton World Federation rules apply to this competition. These are available on <a href="https://www.badminton.org.nz">www.badminton.org.nz</a>
- The referee for the day has overall charge of the event, their decision is final.

#### Order of Merit

- The players shall be arranged strictly in order of merit as submitted in the school grading list.
- The number one singles player will play in the number one doubles position, all other combinations in doubles are changeable but keeping players in order of merit. Should a team have more than four players, they can play their extra players however keeping them in the correct order of merit.
- Players in a team must play in the same order as it appears on the school's teams grading list.
- All singles matches involving players playing out of order on the school's grading list shall be defaulted.

## **Officials**

All players are expected to umpire on the day.

## Uniforms

All players will wear the sports uniform as supplied by their school, which comprises of a t shirt and shorts. Only non-marking shoes or bare feet to be worn on the court.
