Parking

Parking available on Stokes Road in front of the club and behind the club on Paronui Street off Mt Eden Road.

Refreshments

Light snacks and drinking water will be available throughout the day. Students are required to bring their own lunch.

Rubbish

Players are responsible for keeping the grounds and recreation areas reasonably clean and tidy. This includes the correct disposal of rubbish and the return of any crockery or utensils that have been provided by the host club throughout the day.





Conditions of Entry

1 Venue

Mt Eden Bowling Club. Registration period is 8:30 am to 9:00 am. Teams may practice during this time. Play commences at 9:30 am.

2 General Format

- Pairs. Each player will play two bowls in each end.
- Each game will be of 40 minutes or 5 ends, whichever occurs first.
- Games will start and finish on the bell.
- Ends in progress at the end of time will continue.
- Each team will play five games.

3 Game Format

- Each end will start with the jack on the "pink" spot, the mat may be placed anywhere along the centre line marked on the rink.
- If the jack leaves the boundary of the rink at any point during the end, it will be returned and placed on the "blue" spot.
- Each team will take turns playing one bowl each until all bowls are played.
- One shot is scored each end, awarded to the team with the closest bowl to the jack.
 - o A maximum of five points can be scored each game.
- Players may not visit the head between bowls.
- In the event of a default or bye the non-offending team will be awarded the win 3-2.

4 Footwear

All players are to wear flat (not heeled) rubber (not leather) sole shoes or just socks. Bare feet are not permitted. This is required to keep the greens in the best possible condition by preventing the grass being churned up or, synthetic carpets being torn by the grip on players shoes. Footwear that will damage the greens will not be accepted and the player concerned will be asked to remove the shoes and replace them.

5 Bowls

These will be supplied; however, students may bring their own.

6 Determining the winner

One match point will be awarded for each game won, 0.5 for a draw. Final Positions will be ranked based on.

- 1) The team with the highest match points (most wins).
- 2) Then, the team with the most shots scored.
- 3) If all of these are equal, then the teams will be declared "joint winners".
